EXPECTATIONS OF PARENTS

SENIOR PHASE (GRADE 7)

The Grade 7 enrolment fee, includes a YES-assessment (Your Extraordinary Self) with PDF-feedback report. This evaluation is a head start for their high school career. The assessment focusses on understanding your identity and using it to guide decisions which will help future subject choices and career decisions. Should parent wish to have a one-on-one feedback session with the consultant, it can be arranged with him at an additional cost.
